In fact, the Canada Revenue Agency granted us a non-profit organization registration number which will allow us to implement the Community Radio Foundation of Canada, to the benefit of about180 community radio stations across the country.

The Community Radio Fund of Canada (CRFC) is an independent not-for-profit funding organization that has been certified by the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC).

Its mandate is to provide support to campus and community radio stations in Canada and to foster a well-resourced, dynamic, and accessible sector, which constitutes one of the three pillar in the Canadian radio broadcasting system. Thereby, the CRFC's mission is to build and improve campus and community radio for all Canadians through funding and collaborations. The CRFC was founded on November 29th 2007 as the result of a three-year consultation among Canada's largest community radio associations:

- The Alliance des radios communautaires du Canada (ARC du Canada)
- The Association des radiodiffuseurs communautaires du Québec (ARCQ)
- The National Campus and Community Radio Association (NCRA/ANREC)

The campus and community radio sector is accessible, sustainable and reflects the diversity of all Canadians. It contributes to Canada's social, cultural and economic development, promotes volunteerism and leads to locally created programming in urban, rural and remote areas.

Since its creation in 2007, over **\$10 million** were distributed to **127 different radio stations** for the implementation of **443 projects** in 9 provinces and 3 territories.





OUR FUNDING PARTNERS: COMMERCIAL RADIO BROADCASTERS

The following commercial radio broadcasters have contributed both voluntary and mandatory Canadian Content Development (CCD) contributions to the CRFC. First, the CRFC receives at least 0.5% of tangible benefits when there is a transfer of ownership or control of commercial radio undertakings.¹ Second, the CRFC receives at least 15% of commercial radio licensees' basic annual contributions to Canadian Content Development (CCD).²

OUR FUNDING PROGRAMS

RADIOMETRE

In 2012, the CRFC launched for the very first time the *Radiometres* program. Since then, after only 5 rounds of funding, the CRFC distributed more than 6 million dollars to stations throughout Canada for the implementation of hundreds of different projects.

Radiometres has been created to meet both the requirements of the CRTC and the needs of campus and community radio sector. In order to do so, the CRFC has established an outcomes-based approach program. This approach is flexible enough to fund a variety of activities undertaken by different stations as long as the project meets at least one of the three outcomes of the program.

These outcomes, all of which reflect some of the key goals of the campus and community radio sector and the Canadian broadcasting system, are: (1) high-quality, locally-reflective music and spoken word programming; (2) skilled and sustainable volunteer participation in local content creation and operations; and (3) diverse community participation in governance, programming, and content.

The funding for *Radiometres* is provided by Canada's private radio broadcasters through their Canadian Content Development (CCD) contributions, a funding mechanism established by the Canadian Radio-television and Telecommunications Commission (CRTC). These contributions play an important part in the success of the Canadian radio broadcasting system's community sector.



YOUTH ON AIR!

Campus and community radio exists thanks to the commitment and participation of diverse community members. To emphasize this essential role and highlight the importance of youth in this media, the CRFC has decided to put into effect a pilot program called *Youth on Air!* This program is a continuation of the first two programs previously offered by the CRFC: the *Radio Talent Development Program* and the *Youth Internship Program*.

Youth on Air! offers youth aged 16 to 30 a unique radio experience by means of training grants. The program is aimed at stations that are seeking to work with young Canadians in search of mentorship, education, and/or training in broadcasting within a community-oriented radio station. The goal of the program is to increase capacity and outreach of stations through the recruitment, hiring, and training of young talented radio programmers while contributing to new and innovative programming. The components of the program are:

- a) the mentorship, education, and/or training of a youth intern(s);
- b) music or local-interest spoken word programming produced by the intern(s).

The funding distributed under this program, as well as the *Radiometres* program, is provided by Canada's commercial radiobroadcasters through a portion of their Canadian Content Development (CCD) contributions.

ALTIMETRES

Canada's largest community radio associations are:

- The Alliance des radios communautaires du Canada (ARC du Canada) Founded in 1991, ARC du Canada represents 28 stations in nine provinces in two territories.
- The Association des radiodiffuseurs communautaires du Québec (ARCQ) Founded in 1979, ARCQ represents 34 stations in 17 different regions of Quebec.
- The National Campus and Community Radio Association (NCRA/ANREC) Founded in 1986, the NCRA represents 85 licensed stations in nine provinces and three territories.

Together they represent the majority of the 180 campus and community radio stations licensed by the CRTC. They play a strategic role in training volunteers and paid staff, and also offer resources on fundraising, governance, regulatory compliance, and more, including providing stations the opportunity to network and share their ideas.

In 2014-2015, the CRFC (decided to put in place) LAUNCHED a new program called Altimetres focusing on capacity building and training opportunities offered to campus and community stations through their respective associations. As part of this funding envelope, the associations provide services, categorized into the following two areas:

Training: Impart knowledge through skill development workshops or case studies. This includes training for community radio station's volunteers, staff, journalists and technicians; developing marketing strategies to increase advertising income by relying on the market niche of local businesses, who are the most likely to support community radio; capacity building initiatives to attract a bigger audience; provide assistance in financial management, human resources, organizational development and resource evaluation.

Canadian Content Development (CCD): CCD consists of various funding initiatives by broadcasters to help create and promote audio content for broadcasting using Canadian resources. These initiatives provide support, promotion, training and development of Canadian musical and spoken word talent, including journalists. The initiatives undertaken by the associations will be allocated to the support, promotion, training and development of Canadian musical and spoken word talent.
